Creating a Sense of Place: A New Name for GCRCD

The Guadalupe-Coyote Resource Conservation District (also known as GCRCD) is a public agency operating within north Santa Clara County. The District is dedicated to the conservation of natural resources (soil, water and wildlife) and the preservation of agricultural and open space lands. Conventional naming for other RCDs in the State of California usually refer to the county in which they are located, or if there is more than one RCD in a county, to a geographical subarea of a county, for example, RCD of Santa Cruz County, RCD of Monterey County, Alameda County RCD, and West Stanislaus RCD. GCRCD will be considering a new name to better reflect the District's sense of place and align with the way other RCDs have chosen their names, and is seeking community feedback regarding the following potential options:
